

Name of the Program: BA (Hons) in English Description of the program:

The BA (Hons) in English at present offers 48 courses with a total of 142 credits covering 12 semesters for the degree. A minimum CGPA for graduation is 2.50 on a scale of 4.00. A student failing in any of the courses is not allowed to obtain the degree unless completing it within a period of additional 2 years.

Admission Requirements for Undergraduate program :

An applicant seeking admission into an undergraduate program must comply with admission requirements set forth by the admission committee. Students must have completed 12 years of schooling or equivalent. He or she must have earned SSC and HSC certificates with a minimum GPA 2.5 or second division in each, or have completed 5 subjects at O-level and 2 subjects at A-level with GPA 2.0.

Total minimum credit requirement to complete the program: 142 credits Total class weeks in a semester: 15 Minimum CGPA: 2.5

Maximum academic years of completion: 6 years

Scholarship, Stipend & Other Facilities:

A. Merit Award Scholarship. (Based on previous academic attainment. Merit Awards Scholarship provides a waiver of 10%-100% scholarship of the total tuition fees.)

B. Wards of Freedom Fighters' Scholarship. (As a mark of respect to the valiant freedom fighters of the Bangladesh War of Liberation of 1971, the University reserves 3% admission quota for only wards of freedom fighters of all categories, subject to their fulfilments of the minimum admission requirements at the WUB).

C. WUB Special scholarship (scholarships for females, physically handicapped, students from backward areas(Tribal), siblings, spouse, sports persons, artists, and on the basis of admission tests.)

D. Vice Chancellor's Stipend. (The Honorable Vice Chancellor will give five stipends in a semester to the deserving students in consultation with the Treasurer, BOT adviser, Director (Accounts) and representative of BOT.)

Class Timing: Morning, Day & Evening. However, evening classes are meant for service holders.

Promotion and Graduation Policy:

- The minimum passing grade from 1st to 2nd semester is GPA 2.00 (D), from 2nd to 3rd semester is GPA 2.25 (C) and from 3rd semester it is GPA 2.50 (C+) and thereafter.
- ◆ The overall performance of a student is expressed in terms of GRADE POINT Average (GPA) or CGPA.
- A student having a CGPA 2.50 without any 'F' in any course shall normally be awarded the degree.
- A student shall forfeit their eligibility for a scholarship or any special treatment if they fail to meet the requirements for promotion.
